WILLIAM THOMPSON AND HIS DESCENDANTS

Quoting from Stackpole's Old Kittery, page 767.

"There is a tradition that Robert Thompson was the emigrant ancestor of the Thompsons of Durham, N. H. It may have been the one who witnessed a deed in 1652. Thompson's Point, just south of the mouth of the Cochecho River, was so called as early as 1644 and probably in 1635. Thompson's Point House was taxed in Dover in 1648. The name of the owner is not given. Perhaps he had died. William Thompson appears soon after. He received a grant of land in Dover in 1656, which was laid out 17 March 1658-9, "beyond Cochecho log swamp." Nov. 8, 1715, John Thompson, Senior, of Dover, conveyed to John Tuttle fifty acres which "were granted to my father William Thompson by the town of Dover." It lay "beyond Cochecho log swamp," bounded on the south with Bellamy bank River. There is no evidence that William Thompson ever lived on this grant. Oct. 15, 1656, a grant made to John White in 1651 was assigned to William Thompson. It was in Kittery a short way below the south of Sturgeon Creek. Several indications suggest that he married a daughter of John White. In 1659 William Thompson was presented at York Court "for rebellion against his father and mother-in-law," and he bound himself to the Court in bond of twenty pounds "that he will be of good behavior towards all men, especially towards his father and mother." (State copy of Court Records Vol. 1, p. 331.) He died in 1676 and his estate was appraised June 22 of that year, at fifty-two pounds, eighteen shillings. He left 23 acres, a house and orchard in Kittery and 50 acres in Dover, which he gave to sons William and Robert, and John White. His wife had probably died before 1676.

From the above there is no proof that Robert Thompson was related to William Thompson, but was probably either his father or brother.

Maine Wills, p. 876-9.

I Samuel Thompson of York in the County of York, within the Province of the Massachusetts Bay Cordwainer, being in a weak & low State of Body, but thro the Goodness of God of a Sound Mind & Memory, Do make this my last Will and Testament. And I would commit my Soul into ye Hands of God, begging for the Pardon of all my Sins, and eternal Salvation thro the Merits of the Lord Jesus Christ; and my Body I commit to the Earth to be buried in a decent Manner at the discretion of my Executors, hoping for a glorious Resurrection of the same to eternal Life. And the worldly Estate which thro the Kindness of Providence I now possess I give & dispose of as is hereafter mentioned & expressed.

I order my Executors to pay my just Debts & funeral Charges out of my live Stock as soon as may be after my Decease.

I give & bequeath to my beloved Daughter Hannah Thomson (who has been kind & faithful in her Care of me and my children) that part of my Homestead contained in the Field and described as follows, beginning at the Road in the corner of Said Field, and to my Brother Benjamin Thomsons land, and so to run Northerly by Said Road till it comes Even with the tenth Row of Appletrees in my Orchard taking in half Way between the tenth & Eleventh Rows of Trees there; Not accounting two appletrees which Stand a little Distance from Said Orchard as a Row, And from said Road by a Line to run thro My Orchard as aforesaid parallel with the Line of my said Brer Benjamin's Land; and so to Extend from the Said Road the Same Breadth to the Brook that runs thro my Farm, and bounded by the said Brook on the Easterly End, and by ye said Road on the westerly side, by my Brer Benjamin's Land Southerly, and Northerly by the Line above mentioned with all the privileges & Appurtenances thereto belonging to her ye Said Hannah her Heirs & assigns forever. I also give to my Said Daughter Hannah the Use & Improvement of ye great Room in my dwelling House during the time she shall continue single or unmarried, I also give ye Hannah

what Firewood She Shall have occasion of, to burn in her Room during her remaining Single as aforesaid, and to be haled from my Land by my Son Samuel out of that part which I herein give to him as She Shall need.

I give and bequeath to my beloved Son Samuel Thompson the two Thirds of all the remainder of my Estate to him his heirs & Assigns forever to be divided as follows, that part which lies next to my Brother Benjamin's, & next to the Land herein given to my Daughter Hannah being the Southerly part of my Farm, to be to the said Samuel use Barn & all the Privileges & appurtenances to the main mentioned to my Daughter Hannah.

Pinchas the one Third of my real estate that Shall be set off, to be divided & set off to him on the side next to Lands of my Broer Joseph Thompson thereunto belonging to him the said forever.

When be received and taken care of in my until such time as Suitable places be provided in good Families.

For providing for the necessary Subsistence of my Family the Winter following my Decease, I give to my Son Samuel two thirds & to my Son Pinchas one third of all my live Stock that shall remain, and also all my Utensils of Husbandry & Moveables, out of Doors, Samuel paying two thirds and Pinchas one third of my Debts, Legacies and Funeral Charges.

I give to my four Daughters namely Hannah, Dorcas, Elisabeth & Tabitha all my Household Stuff-consisting of Beds Bedding & Furniture Pewter Iron & Wooden Ware of all Sorts Chairs Tables Glasses, and all Indoor Moveables to be Improved by them until my Youngest Surviving Daughter shall arrive at the age of fourteen and then to be equally divided between them or their Survivors.

I give to my Daughter Dorcas Thomson Eight pounds lawful Money to be paid her

by my Son Samuel when She Shall arrive at the age of eighteen years.

I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Thomson Eight pounds lawful Money to be paid her by my Son Samuel when she shall arrive at the Age of Eighteen years.

I give to my Daughter Tabitha Thomson Eight Pounds lawful Money to be paid her by my Son Phineas when She shall become to the age of eighteen years.

I do hereby constitute & appoint my two sons Samuel and Phineas Executors of this my Last Will & Testament exhorting and requiring them to be kind & obliging to their Sisters, and to live in love & peace, one with the other that the God of Love & peace may be with them.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and seal the 24th Day of October Anno Domi: 1759 in the thirty-third year of His Majts Reign.

Phineas Thompson.

Phineas Thompson the son of Samuel Thompson and his wife Hannah (Brackett) Thompson was born in 1735, Married Martha Willard the daughter of Samuel and Mary Willard, on April 10, 1762.

History of Sanford, Maine, by Emery, page 84. Thompson Phineas. "The ancestors of Deacon Phineas Thompson lived in York, Maine. He married Martha, daughter of Samuel Willard of York 1762, and removed from Gorhamtown (Gorham) to Sanford, about 1765. He was a farmer and blacksmith and lived near Thompson's now Butler's Bridge. He was one of the original members of the Baptist Church and for many years one of its deacons. He was the father of:

## Ezra Thompson.

Thompson from History of Sanford, Maine pps. 509, 510, 511, "Ezra was the oldest of the eight children of Phineas (see page 84) and Martha (Willard) Thompson. He was born in Gorham March 29, 1763, but came to Sanford when a babe with his parents, and spent the whole of his subsequent life here. His ancestors were of Scottish origin. On his fathers farm at Thompson's, now Butler's bridge, Ezra grew a farmer, a blacksmith and a thinker. In 1781 his younger brother Samuel enlisted in the Revolutionary War, but so great were the anxiety and grief of the mother that Ezra resolved to take his brothers place. He served at Sandbury-Canada (Bethel), and came near losing his life by an accidental blow of an axe. Having been conveyed down the river in a boat, his party came to some rapids around which they felt unable to carry the weak and wounded soldier. Their only recourse was to leave him, with the hope of a possible chance to send for him. While young Thompson was viewing the fearful prospect of death by starvation or by the wild beasts, a Scotchman, "Kit" Chiffener by name, stepped forward, and saying "Thompson is too guid bluid to be left here;" placed him on his back, and carefully carried him to the desired place, three-quarters of a mile below.

When about twenty, Mr. Thompson attended "Master" Clark's school a short term, in which he learned, as he used to say, more than all he learned in other schools. For years he was a public school teacher, and that he was worthy the title of "Master" there is no doubt, for his old pupils were wont to speak very much in his praise. At the age of fifty-two, the father of ten children, farmer, blacksmith, teacher, and surveyor, he began the study of Latin and Greek under Farson Sweet.

For thirty-six consecutive years, 1794-1829, perhaps more, "Master" Thompson held some public office. He was selectman fourteen years, on the school committee eleven years, town treasurer three, coroner seventeen, and justice of the peace seventeen besides serving on many committees for the transaction of town business.

He was one of the selectmen in 1808 when the town authorized them to petition President Jefferson for the removal of the Embargo, and in 1816, one of the delegates to the convention in Brunswick. In politics he was a Whig. Mr. Thompson united with the Baptist Church in 1798, and continued a strong pillar in the church and society until his death.

Ezra Thompson died November 8, 1835. Elder Cook preached his funeral sermon from the text, "He was a good man." From all that has come down to us, we can assert with all confidence that a truer word was never spoken."



## 5. Generation.

Isaac Thompson 1st.

As Isaac Thompson 1st. was always referred to as Deacon Isaac after he became a Deacon in the church he will be called Deacon Isaac in future in this record.

The following was written by Curtis Austin Thompson. "Though he was not an educated man, as we understand the term he was very well informed, a great reader of the Bible, and very few could get the better of him in any argument on any passage of the scriptures. He was a man of excellent habits and much respected by all who knew him. He took a deep interest in current events. The day before his death, wanting the newspaper of which he was a constant reader, he walked uptown for it and back, one mile, as was his custom. He was one of the 43 pew owners of the First Church of Cornish, Maine, the first pastor being Rev. Timothy Remik. He was one of the 100 inhabitants of Cornish, Maine, previous to its incorporation in 1794, and a tax payer there. He died very suddenly at the ripe old age of nearly 98½ years, terminating thus a long and worthy life, a life of duration excelled by few, the result, undoubtedly of a hardy constitution inherited from hardy ancestors, and of his own early activities in the open wilds of Maine with his associates, together with that life of moderation which was habitual with him. I was only seven years old when I left Cornish, Maine with my parents, my Grandfather, Deacon Isaac Thompson, was then 87 years old, I can remember him quite well. Unimportant events often make lasting impressions on minds of youth and during my early and short associations with this dear old man who was such a frequent visitor at our home a few such minor incidents, noticeable to a child, but trivial to those of more mature years, are still remembered after a lapse of over seventy years, we still remember those kindly features, still see him in our Cornish, Maine, home on more than one occasion, see him wipe his spectacles on mothers window curtain, and watch him take from his pocket the little tobacco wonder box of our childish memory and extract a

small square of the weed from its contents, the habit of using tobacco having been formed when he was eight years old, though he was never known to use more than one small square a day, and that square was never chewed. Again with Grandfather Isaac and other of his grandchildren, we find ourselves in the old orchard back of his home near the Ossipee River gathering apples for us from the old summer apple tree. Also we remember a visit to his room upstairs on a cold winter evening in company with a cousin, where we found him alone by a little stove that was heated red hot, a fact which particularly attracted our youthful attention.

He is said to have early in life united with the Baptist Church at Cornish, Maine, to which town he had removed from Sanford, Maine, and was the faithful Deacon of that Church for many years.

Deacon Isaac Thompson married at Sanford, Maine, May 6, 1790, to Mchitable Chadbourne, a woman of estimable qualities.

Married (2nd) to Miss Stuart, "who died in less than two years after the marriage."

Married (3rd) to the widow of Noah S. Barker who died at Cornish, Maine, March 19, 1850, aged 75 years and 10 months."

The following is by Ray Harmon Thompson, from the records of the Library of Maine, the town records of Sanford, Maine, and the records of Cornish, Maine.

"Deacon Isaac Thompson the third child of Phineas Thompson and his wife Martha (Willard) Thompson was born July 8, 1767, at Sanford, Maine, moved to (francisborough) now Cornish in 1784, settling in the valley beside the Ossipee River. This is the part of Cornish once called Cornishville and later became the Village of Cornish (after most of the houses in the old village were placed on skids and drawn by oxen over the crust of snow to the valley). He joined the Baptist Church in 1788, and became a deacon in that church a few years later."

## 10. Isaac Thompson 2nd.

The following was written by Curtis Austin Thompson. "Isaac Thompson Jr. the second child of Deacon Isaac Thompson and his third wife Mrs. Noah S. (Barker) Thompson, was born and married in Cornish, Maine, was a cooper by trade, tho he was a farmer the greatest part of his life, and tho deprived of a complete common school education, he was a well read man, a man of good judgement and very successful in all his farming operations. Through all of his varied experiences he always had the cooperation of a capable and devoted wife.

In politics he was first a Whig, and then a Republican from the birth of that party until his death. His first vote for a President, however, was for Andrew



Jackson, 7th. President, a Federalist, for his second term in 1832, the Whig party being formed in 1834.

He was an exceptionally silent man, strictly reliable, with a character above reproach. Physically about the average in height and weight, he was very athletic, and noted in the community at large for his strength, activity and wrestling achievements. So much confidence had the people of Cornish in his wrestling ability, that he was matched with a champion wrestler of the Van Amborg caravan, at one time when that noted traveling show of those days was exhibiting at Cornish, with the result that their champion wrestler was thrown by him.

The an upright and moral citizen, he was not a member of any religious organization during his active life, but both he and his wife did join the Congregational Church at Reinbeck, Iowa, after his retirement from business, and remained faithful members of that church until their deaths. Mr. Thompson died at Reinbeck on March 28, 1892, and his wife died at the home of their daughter, Mrs. Barrett March 28, 1903.

Previous to his marriage, Isaac Thompson worked in the logging camps of the Maine forests during the winter months, and assisted in rafting the logs down the Ossipee River when the ice broke up in the spring. This rafting was not only a dangerous occupation, but one of great exposure as well. The nature of the work required those following it to be in the icy water much of the time while they were at work. From such severe exposure he finally contracted a bad cold, which settled on his lungs, so seriously affecting those organs that it came near being fatal.

Believing a change of climate would be beneficial to him, he decided to move with his little family to the comparatively wild country of Southern Wisconsin. A brother of his wife, William Henry Miller, had gone west for the benefit of his health some two years previous to this and settled on Liberty Prairie in Southern Wisconsin. Mr. Thompson and his family stopped at the Miller home after

their long trip.

The railroad then terminated at Buffalo, New York, and from there they took a steamboat west the length of Lake Erie to Detroit, Michigan. From Detroit they went by rail to Janesville, Wisconsin. Mr. Miller lived on a prairie farm about 30 miles from Janesville. They hired a light two horse rig at the hotel in Janesville to take them to the farm. This trip thro a new country was always remembered, as well as the whole trip from Maine west.

Adjoining the farm of Mr. Miller's on the west there was a partly improved farm of 53 acres with a small story and a half house about 40 rods west, which Mr. Thompson bought of a Mr. Green. There was also a small nursery of apple trees on the north side of the road, 18 acres of the farm being on that side of the road.

The begining of a new home on the open prairies of Wisconsin amid such entirely different surroundings, was indeed a radical change for him.

Because of his physical handicap and limited means, the first few years were years of hard struggle and deprivations. Successful in having his health restored by the change of climate and new environments, he finally succeeded in his farming operations. He lived and prospered on his little farm for 14 years, but desiring more land for himself and his now large family of 8 children, he decided to sell out and go still farther west where the land was cheaper.

After driving the long way of about 500 miles in a "Covered Wagon", he arrived at the home of Charles B. Miller, oldest son of Mr. Miller. Mr. Thompson and two of his sons who were with him, made their home with Mr. Miller, until they succeeded in buying a half section of land. They paid  $5\frac{1}{2}$  dollars an acre for the land on the open, treeless prairies of Grundy County, Iowa, near the present town of Reinbeck, 24 miles from Waterloo, the nearest railroad town.

On one corner of this farm he built a comfortable story and a half house, hired 40 acres of his prairie land to be turned over by a breaking plow, and then returned the long way to Wisconsin. In October of 1867 in "Covered Wagons," containing

all of his household effects, he moved to his new home in Iowa.

He later built a new house on a raise of ground about 100 rods south of the highway, where for many years he lived and prospered and was a highly esteemed citizen. He was well advanced in life before any change came in his coal black hair and beard. A man of truly sterling qualities. His children:

The following was written by Curtis Austin Thompson. "Pauline Miller Thompson, the oldest child of Isaac Thompson 2nd. and Sarah Barker (Miller) Thompson, was

born in Cornish, Maine, December 15, 1842, where she spent her early childhood days and attended public schools. In the spring of 1853, she moved with her parents to Wisconsin where they settled on a small farm on Liberty Prairie near Deerfield. There she attended the public school, but before finishing her common school education, when she was only 14 years of age, she taught one term of school two miles south of her prairie home in a Norwegian settlement. Then she returned to school to complete her common school education.

After completing the Prairie district school she attended Albion Academy, a noted school at that time located in Dane County, three miles north of the little railroad town of Edgerton, and twelve miles south of her home.

After leaving the academy, she taught school in district No. 6, a large Norwegian district one and one half miles from her home in the edge of a timber belt at the east end of the prairie. She taught there for several years, until the fall of 1867 when she moved with her parents to Iowa, where they settled on a farm just east of the present town of Reinbeck.

In Iowa she continued her teaching in different districts in that part of the County, in the vicinity of what is now the town of Reinbeck. She taught from the time of her arrival in Iowa until her marriage, October 11, 1873 to James Edward Barrett, when they moved to a farm four and one half miles east of Reinbeck.

She remained on the farm until 1897, when Mr. Barrett retired and moved to Waterloo, Iowa, where she remained until the time of her death, August 28, 1904, at the age of 61 years, 8 months, 13 days.

She was an advocate of higher education and took great interest in her school work. She was very devoted to her family and other relatives, and was always ready to help and give an encouraging word and make any sacrifice for her friends and loved ones.

She was a member of the Methodist Church and took an active part in Church work and in community activities.

The following was written by Curtis Austin Thompson. "Prentice Mellen Thompson, the second child of Isaac Thompson Jr. and Sarah Parker (Miller) Thompson was born in Cornish, Maine, May 16, 1845, and moved to Liberty Prairie, Wisconsin, with his parents in the spring of 1853.

He served in the Civil War as a recruit in Company G, 20th. Regiment, the Company of which his cousin, Edward G. Miller, was Captain.

He married Harriet Gove at Delavan, Walworth County, Wisconsin. Mrs. Thompson was born June 2, 1848. Both had common school education, tho she attended school at Albion Academy a few terms. She died at Waterloo, Iowa, October 4th, 1929.

He moved to Grundy County, Iowa, in the fall of 1867, settling on a farm about one mile east of the present town of Reinbeck.

Mr. Thompson was a very successful farmer, and in good financial condition at the time of his death in 1880 when still a young man of 36 years.

While he was exceptionally robust and active as a young man, his health was so injured during his army service by exposure and sickness that that was the cause of his untimely death, tho the immediate cause of it was a severe hemorrhage of the lungs which caused his death about two weeks later.

The following is by Ray Harmon Thompson. "Curtis Austin Thompson, the third child of Isaac Thompson 2nd and Sarah Barker (Miller) Thompson, was born at Cornish, Maine, April 7, 1846. He spent his early childhood days, and his first school days at Cornish. When about five years of age he had a fall which injured his lower spine so badly that it crippled him for life. When playing in front of his home with his brother, Prentice, and other boys, some older boys came by and got rough with them, throwing him down so hard that it injured his spine.

In the spring of 1853, he moved with his parents to Liberty Prairie, Wisconsin, where he lived for 14 years, spending his time in school and helping with the farm work. After completing the grade school he attended Albion Academy at Albion, Wisconsin for several terms, then entered Eastmans Business College at Chicago, Illinois, where he graduated.

In the spring of 1867, he went to Iowa with his father and brother, Prentice, making the trip in a covered wagon. His father bought a farm in Grundy County just east of the present town of Reinbeck, where they built a new home. In midsummer they returned to Wisconsin to bring the rest of the family to the new home in Iowa. On their return trip to Wisconsin, he stopped at Dubuque, Iowa, taking a steamboat from there to St. Paul, Minnesota, going to visit his Aunt Mary (Miller) Patten in Minneapolis, Minnesota. While there he had part of his foot amputated, which gave him much relief from his early injury. In the fall of 1867, he returned to Iowa where his family had established themselves in their new home in Grundy County.

He spent the next six years teaching school in his own and nearby German district during the winter months and helping improve his father's new farm during the summers by setting out groves around the house. Then he was appointed to a government position at Washington, D. C., where he remained until 1876. He was married to Arabella Ann Cowell at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on August 19, 1876. She was a physician who graduated from Mt. Carroll Seminary at Mt. Carroll, Illinois, and the Hahnemann Medical College at Chicago, Illinois. They visited the Centennial Exposition, then returned to their home at Reinbeck, Iowa.

He bought a farm in Fairfield Township, Grundy County, Iowa, just north of the present town of Dike. He remained on the farm for over three years, where his first two children were born. Then he moved to Reinbeck, Iowa, where he and his brother, Sydney, operated a creamery for two years. In the spring of 1882 he sold his interest to his brother and he with his wife and family of three small children, the third being born in Reinbeck, moved to Kansas, locating in Osborne County, on a 1120 acre ranch, 11 miles southwest of Osborne. He remained there for 10 years, devoting his time to raising live stock.

In the spring of 1892, his family now having increased to seven children, he moved to Osborne in order to give the children better school advantages, and so his wife could practice her profession.

While living in Osborne, he still operated his ranch until he sold it in the

spring of 1905.

In July 1901, he and his oldest son, Lewis, bought a machine and blacksmith shop in Osborne, which they operated until February 8, 1908, when it was destroyed by fire. They did not rebuild. He remained in Osborne until the spring of 1910. As all of the children were now scattered to different parts of the country making homes of their own, he and his wife moved to Denver, Colorado, to live with their son, Lee, where they remained until February 1911. At that time they moved to Ontario, California, to keep house for their son, Lewis, who had lost his wife, leaving him with two small children. Later they moved with their son to Los Angeles where they lived until 1914, when they moved with him to Orange, California, living there until the death of Mrs. Thompson November 22, 1915.

In the spring of 1916, he went to Deming, New Mexico, to make his home with his son, Lee. He remained there several years, then returned to California, where he lived the remainder of his life, dividing his time among his children.

In 1916 he made a trip to Iowa, where he visited relatives in Reinbeck, Cedar Rapids and Waterloo, returning to Deming in the fall. In 1929 he made another trip east, visiting his brother, Clare, and other relatives, and his old home in Osborne, Kansas; his son, Ray, in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, relatives in Waterloo; and his old homes in Reinbeck and in Fairfield Township, Grundy County, Iowa. He also visited his old home in Liberty Prairie, Wisconsin. On his return trip to California he stopped at Deming, New Mexico, to visit his son, Lee.

Curtis Austin Thompson lived in the period of the great development of the country, when the eastern pioneers and European emigrants were streaming west into the great open prairies and plains to establish new homes in a new country and endure the hardships and privations necessary in developing a new country. He was one of those pioneers, and continued to move west to help develop new territory; first to Wisconsin, then Iowa, Kansas, and finally to the west coast.

He remembered well the early years in Kansas, where settlers were scarce, and

when the roads were only trails across the open prairies. He could see covered wagons coming and going, some going on west to find new country and new homes, others returning east after trying the west and becoming dissatisfied and returning to their eastern homes.

He also saw great changes in transportation. In his move with his parents from Maine to Wisconsin, their household goods were shipped by rail to Milwaukee, Wisconsin and hauled to Liberty Prairie in ox carts. The family made the trip by stage coach from Cornish, Maine, to Portland, Maine; from Portland to Buffalo, New York, by railroad; from Buffalo to Detroit, Michigan, by steamboat; from Detroit to Janesville, Wisconsin, by railroad; and from Janesville to Liberty Prairie by stage coach. The move from Wisconsin to Iowa was made by covered wagons, and from Iowa to Kansas by railroad.

While on the ranch in Kansas their first transportation was by lumber wagon, later the spring wagon and, finally, the horse and buggy. Later in Osborne came the automobile, and he lived to see the aeroplane and took several rides in one with one of his grandsons.

He took an active part in civic affairs, was an advocate of better schools and higher education, was a member of the Workman Lodge, and took an active part in politics, being a republican all his life. He voted in 17 presidential elections, his first vote being for President Grant in 1868.

He took much interest in family histories, spending much of his time in the later years of his life at that work, carefully compiling a number of them, and collecting a large portion of the data in this history of the Thompson family.

He enjoyed good health during his entire life, and his death came January 1, 1935, from old age, having lived 88 years, 8 months, and 25 days."

"Mayo Clare Thompson, the fifth child of Isaac Thompson 2nd and Sarah Barker (Miller) Thompson, was born at Cornish, Maine, October 10, 1850, and moved with his parents to Wisconsin in 1853. The family settled on a small farm on Liberty Prairie near Deerfield, where he spent his boyhood days helping on the farm and attending school during the winter months. He also spent much time hunting; wild game being very plentiful in those early days.

In 1867 he moved with his parents to Iowa, where the family settled on a farm just east of the present town of Reinbeck in Grundy County. He worked on his father's farm until he was married November 17, 1873, at Elk Horn Grove, Carroll

County, Illinois, to Lucy Arabella Cowell. She was a Physician who graduated from Mt. Carroll Seminary at Mt. Carroll, Illinois, and the Hahnemann Medical College at Chicago, Illinois.

After his marriage he bought a farm in Fairfield Township, Grundy County, Iowa, just north of the present town of Dike. He operated this farm until 1879, when he with his wife and two small children, Mary Rebecca Thompson and Sydney Roy Thompson, continued their westward move looking for new country. They settled in Osborne County, Kansas, about eleven miles southwest of Osborne on Covert Creek, where he bought a farm and remained there until the time of his death November 13, 1935, at the age of 85 years 1 month and three days.

He was a farmer all his life, industrious, progressive and very successful in all his farm operations. His farming was diversified, raising most of the crops adaptable in that locality. His big crops were corn and alfalfa, always having large fields of alfalfa. He also raised horses, cattle and hogs. Hogs were his specialty and he always had many fine ones on his farm. He was also a lover of horses and always maintained many fine draft and driving horses and saddle ponies.

He was continually improving his farm and keeping it up to date by building up the soil, fencing, building new and up to date buildings and building dams to conserve the water supply.

He was one of the early pioneers in Wisconsin, Iowa and Kansas, when those states were open unsettled prairies and he saw the great development of those states in those early days. When he settled in Kansas, that part of the state was an open prairie with but few settlers. The roads were only trails across the country, routes for adventurers going to new land to build new homes and develop a new country. Many of the new homes were built from native sod, and their stables from native timber and straw. Their hardships were many and only the hardiest were able to survive the first few years in their new homes. Many returned east to their old homes.



Mr. Thompson's first home in Kansas was a log house, built from native timber, in which he lived for many years. This house is still standing near his last modern home.

He liked outdoor life. He learned to hunt during his boyhood days in Wisconsin, and he continued his hunting in Iowa and Kansas and was an excellent marksman. In Iowa the game was mostly wild chicken and quail. During those early days in Kansas there was an abundance of wild game on the prairies including Deer and Antelope, and a short distance west there were Buffalo. He spent much of his time hunting, bringing home many Deer and Antelope. He went Buffalo hunting several times and on at least one occasion killed a Buffalo. In later years after the Deer and Antelope had disappeared his game was Prairie Chicken, Quail, Ducks and Geese. He also hunted and killed many Coyotes.

He was a leader in the community and took an active part in many community activities. He also took part in politics but never ran for a public office. He was a Republican all his life, his first vote being for President Grant for his second term in 1872.

He lost his wife on August 19, 1883, leaving him with two small children. On July 29, 1884 he married Edna Lenora Cronk, from this union there were six children as follows:

"Sydney Clark Thompson, the 6th. child of Isaac Thompson Jr. and his wife Sarah Barker (Miller) Thompson, was born March 7, 1853, in Cornish, York County, Maine, married Mary E. Williams August 25, 1880, at Waterloo, Iowa, who was born October 12, 1851, in Bloomington Township, Clinton County, Iowa.

Moving from his native state to Liberty Prairie, Southern Wisconsin with his parents when only six weeks old, he lived there the first 14 years of his life and then moved with them to Grundy County, Iowa, where his father had previously bought a half section of prairie land for five and one half dollars an acre, near where Reinbeck was started several years later.

He was a farmer and worked on his father's farm a number of years, or until his marriage to Miss Williams, when he bought a home in Reinbeck and engaged in the creamery business with his brother, which was continued very successfully for a few years. His brother moved to Kansas Sydney taking over the creamery business.

A few years later he sold the creamery and moved to Osborne, Kansas in 1892.

The following was written by Curtis Austin Thompson. "Clyde Otis Thompson, the 8th child of Isaac Thompson Jr. and his wife, Sarah, was born February 14, 1861, on Liberty Prairie, Wisconsin, and removed to Iowa with his parents in October 1867, settling on a farm near the present town of Reinbeck.

He married Ellen Amelia Long July 24, 1883, in Reinbeck. Miss Long was born in England June 24, 1860, and came to Reinbeck with her mother.

The first few years of their married life was spent on his father's farm near Reinbeck, then moving to Osborne County, Kansas, Mr. Thompson was engaged a few years in farming his brother Clare's farm on Covert Creek. In the fall of 1887

he returned to Reinbeck to take charge of his father's farm, operating it for about 9 years. After his father's death the farm was sold about 1896 and Clyde moved to Ocheyedan, Iowa, where the family resided on a farm of their own for about 12 years. #### THOMAS CURTIS

"This settler, the youngest of the four who came here from Scituate in 1642, was the son of Thomas and Richardene (.....) Curtis of Ash-Justa-Sandwich, County Kent. By the odd name of his mother it was possible to identify him and his antecedents. His father was a well-to-do tecton living successively at Worth, Ewell, again at Worth, and finally at Ash, where he died and was buried December 11, 1631, having made a will which named his wife executrix (Consistory Cant. xvii, fo 51.) Unfortunately this will is missing from the files, but the inventory is extant which shows the large property valued at four hundred and twenty-six pounds, sixteen shillings.

"Of the parentage of Thomas Curtis, the elder, nothing certain can be stated. An ancient and well-known family of this name was resident of Appledore, Kent, as early as 1450, and several descendants were mayors of Tenterden, from whence came several emigrants to Scituate, but extensive search fails to find a place for this Thomas in it. This Appledore-Tenterden Curtis family were armigerous and appear in the "Heralds Visitations." With all the evidence available it is the author's opinion that he is probably identical with the Thomas, son of John Curtis of Folkstone, Kent, who was baptized in that parish November 26, 1574, having younger brothers William and John, which were the names given to his own children. Thomas Curtis of Ash was twice married, first to Bennett Lott (Ide. Dec., 22, 1612), by whom he had issue:
